A reading anticipation (RA) guide is an assignment that engages students more actively with their assigned reading. Using an RA guide, students are asked to agree or disagree with a series of statements before they read the text. These statements are designed to:

Anticipation Guides—Reading and Writing Strategies

Anticipation Guide According to Reading Rockets (2015), "An anticipation guide is a comprehension strategy that is used before reading to activate students' prior knowledge and build curiosity about a new topic." Prior to reading, students read a list of statements about a given topic and begin to make connections with a text they will soon read.

Activating Prior Knowledge & Anticipation Guide—Reading

Anticipation Guides are front-loading tools that allow for students to view main ideas within a text prior to reading it through analyzing statements about the material within the passage.

Anticipation guides stimulate students' interest in a topic and set a purpose for reading. They teach students to make predictions, anticipate the text, and verify their predictions. They connect new information to prior knowledge and build curiosity about a new topic.

Anticipation Guide. This comprehension strategy activates students' prior knowledge, builds curiosity about a new topic before learning about it, and then checks for understanding after the topic is presented. Before beginning the lesson, students listen to or read several statements about key concepts within the new content and choose whether they agree or disagree.
